



### ABSTRACT

Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project- Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme – Creation of Corpus Fund to help the needy and poor people who undergo specialized Surgeries under the Scheme – Revision of sharing pattern to reimbursement accruing to the Government Hospitals under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme – Orders – Issued.

### ORDER:

In the G.O. 1<sup>st</sup> read above, sanction was accorded for Rs.10.00 Crore to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, for creating an initial Corpus Fund to help the needy and poor people, especially children, who undergo any one of the following specialized surgeries under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme and to bear the extra cost of the surgery of more than the eligible amount of Rs. 1.5 lakh per annum from the Corpus Fund.

- i. Liver Transplantation
- ii. Renal Transplantation including post transplant procedure for immunosuppressant therapy
- iii. Bone Marrow Transplantation.
- iv. Cochlear Implantation.
- v. Stem Cell Transplantation.

Further, to mobilise funds of Rs.20 crore per annum to the Corpus fund to run it on a long term, the sharing pattern of reimbursement accruing to Government hospitals under the Chief Minister's Health insurance was revised @ 15% to the Medical Team, 50% for consumables / department requirements, 22.5% for hospital upgradation and 12.5% for the corpus fund. The revised sharing pattern was to be reexamined in 2013-14. The United India Insurance Company was requested to remit the 12.5% of reimbursement directly to the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation.

3. The Project Director has now stated that the amount of Rs.10 crore was drawn and credited to the Corpus Fund as per G.O (Rt) No.992, Finance (BG-I) Department, dated: 24.12.12 and G.O (Ms) No.148, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated: 24.06.13. As per the Orders issued in the above mentioned G.Os, the United India Insurance Company is remitting 12.5% of the Government Hospital's claims under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme to the Corpus Fund on day to day basis.

4. The Project Director has proposed that the sharing pattern of reimbursement accruing to the Government Hospitals under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme specified in the G.O 1<sup>st</sup> read above may be revised as follows:

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore requested to issue necessary amendment to the G.O 1<sup>st</sup> read above.

6. The Government, after careful examination, have decided to accept the request of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Accordingly, the Government direct that the sharing pattern of reimbursement accruing to the Government Hospitals under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme ordered in the G.O 1<sup>st</sup> read above shall be revised as follows:
